Operation Sindoor: Indian Forces Precision Strike on Terror Camps



07-May-25

In the early hours of May 7, 2025, the Indian Armed Forces launched a swift and coordinated offensive codenamed Operation Sindoor, delivering 24 precision missile and air strikes on nine terrorist camps located across Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK). Lasting only 25 minutes, the operation successfully targeted infrastructure belonging to terror outfits Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM) and Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT), neutralizing over 70 militants and crippling key command-and-control nodes without striking Pakistani military installations or civilian infrastructure.

Among the sites struck were Markaz Subhanallah in Bahawalpur, Markaz Taiba in Muridke, Sarjal and Mehmoona Joya near Sialkot, Sawai Nala and Syedna Bilal in Muzaffarabad, Gulpur and Abbas in Kotli, and Barnala in Bhimber. These locations were identified as central to training, indoctrination, and logistical operations supporting cross-border terrorism against India.

The mission featured close coordination between the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force, utilizing Rafale jets equipped with SCALP and AASM Hammer precision-guided munitions, as well as indigenously developed loitering munitions from DRDO-private-sector collaborations. Real-time intelligence, surveillance, target acquisition, and reconnaissance (ISTAR) assets enabled highly accurate strikes, minimizing the risk of collateral damage. According to official briefings from the Ministry of Defence and Press Information Bureau, there were no reported civilian casualties.

Operation Sindoor represents a doctrinal evolution in India's counterterrorism strategy, favoring limited, non-escalatory preemptive strikes focused strictly on terror infrastructure. Unlike previous responses such as the 2016 surgical strikes and the 2019 Balakot airstrikes, this operation emphasized restraint while delivering a decisive blow to those responsible for attacks on Indian soil.

Following the strike, India initiated diplomatic outreach to key global stakeholders, emphasizing that the operation was a targeted counterterrorism measure, not an act of war. The move drew sharp condemnation from Pakistan's military and government, which claimed violations of sovereignty, alleged civilian casualties, and vowed retaliation "at a time and place of our choosing." Meanwhile, international actors including the United States, China, and Russia urged both nations to exercise restraint to avoid escalation in a volatile, nuclear-armed region.

Operation Sindoor underlines India's strategic resolve to dismantle terrorist networks beyond its borders while managing geopolitical risks—reinforcing its commitment to protecting national security through calibrated and lawful military responses.

Operation Sindoor: India's Strong Response to Pahalgam Attack

In response to the tragic Pahalgam terror attack that claimed 26 lives, India launched Operation Sindoor, marking a significant military action against terror camps in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir. Union Home Minister Amit Shah praised the armed forces for their precision in striking nine high-value targets linked to terrorism while ensuring no civilian casualties, emphasizing India's commitment to eradicating terrorism at its roots. Defence Minister

Rajnath Singh likened the operation to Lord Hanuman's destruction of Ashok Vatika, highlighting the courage and success of the Indian forces in executing targeted strikes against terror infrastructure, particularly in Bahawalpur, a stronghold of the Jaish-e-Mohammad. The operation was characterized as focused, measured, and non-escalatory, with an emphasis on dismantling terrorist capabilities without escalating tensions with Pakistan. This decisive action showcases India's resolve to respond robustly to terror threats while maintaining a strategy of restraint, reflecting a calculated approach to ensuring national security and justice for the victims of the attack. The operation also serves as a reminder of India's strategic military preparedness and the government's unwavering support for its armed forces in combating terrorism.

Hyderabad on high alert; public urged to stay vigilant amid Operation

Pakistan PM Acknowledges India's Targeted Action Against Terrorism

Masood Azhar confirms loss of 10 relatives in India's Bahawalpur strike

Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) chief Masood Azhar confirmed the death of 10 family members and four associates during India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted the JeM's operational hub in Bahawalpur. The operation, reportedly aimed at dismantling infrastructure associated with JeM, Lashkar-e-Taiba, and Hizbul Mujahideen, was characterized by the Indian Army as focused and measured, avoiding Pakistani military sites. The Markaz Subhan Allah complex, which served as a recruitment and indoctrination center, was reduced to ruins, underscoring the precision of the strikes. Azhar's acknowledgment of the casualties, including his elder sister, family members, and aides, reflects the operation's significant impact on the terrorist organization's leadership. While India highlighted the operation as a necessary response to cross-border terrorism, Pakistan condemned it, alleging civilian casualties, which India countered by emphasizing the focus on terror-related targets. This

operation marks a pivotal shift in India's counter-terrorism strategy, showcasing its commitment to addressing and dismantling terror infrastructure. Overall, Operation Sindoor sends a strong message against cross-border terrorism and reinforces India's stance on proactively defending its national security interests.

India Dismisses OIC's Statement on Pahalgam Terror Attack as Absurd

India has strongly rejected the Organisation of Islamic Cooperation's (OIC) statement regarding the Pahalgam terror attack, labeling it absurd for not acknowledging the attack's cross-border connections linked to Pakistan. The Ministry of External Affairs criticized the OIC for being manipulated by Pakistan, emphasizing that their interference in India's internal matters is unwarranted. The OIC's call for restraint and dialogue between India and Pakistan was viewed as an attempt to overlook Pakistan's role in cross-border terrorism. This incident underscores India's commitment to addressing terrorism while dismissing external pressures that seek to undermine its sovereignty.

Pakistan Defence Minister Withdraws Claim of Indian Soldiers Captured

On May 7, 2025, Pakistan's Defence Minister Khawaja Muhammad Asif retracted his earlier claim of capturing Indian soldiers during heightened tensions following India's Operation Sindoor airstrikes on May 6, which targeted terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan. Despite initial reports suggesting captured Indian PoWs, Asif clarified that Indian soldiers had abandoned their posts but none were taken prisoner. The airstrikes were a response to a deadly terror attack in Pahalgam, attributed to Pakistan, marking a significant escalation in conflict. This situation underscores Pakistan's attempt to manipulate narratives amid India's decisive military actions, reinforcing India's resolve to counter terrorism emanating from its neighbor.

Jammu and Kashmir resulted in the tragic deaths of at least 12 civilians, including four children, and injured many others. This escalation followed India's missile strikes against nine terror targets in Pakistan and Pakistan-Occupied Kashmir, aimed at avenging a prior terror attack that killed 26 civilians. The Indian Army has responded decisively, claiming to have caused significant casualties and damage to Pakistani positions while exercising restraint in targeting, focusing solely on terrorist infrastructure. In light of the ongoing violence, local residents have been forced to seek refuge in underground bunkers, and authorities have closed educational institutions in several border districts. The situation reflects ongoing tensions in the region, exacerbated by repeated ceasefire violations from Pakistan, underlining the necessity for India to maintain a robust defensive posture while also demonstrating restraint to prevent escalation into broader conflict. The Indian armed forces' calibrated response underscores their commitment to safeguarding national security while minimizing civilian casualties, which is critical in maintaining regional stability amidst persistent provocations. The situation necessitates continued vigilance and strategic planning by the Indian defense establishment to counter these threats effectively.

IAF's Operation Sindoor: Rafales Deploy SCALP and Hammer Missiles

India executed Operation Sindoor on May 6, 2025, employing Rafale fighter jets for precision airstrikes against terrorist infrastructures in Pakistan and Pakistan-administered Kashmir, marking the aircraft's combat debut. The IAF likely utilized SCALP cruise missiles and Hammer bombs during the operation, demonstrating the advanced capabilities of the Rafale, a 4.5-generation multi-role combat aircraft. These precision strikes, targeting locations like Muzaffarabad and Sialkot, showcased India's enhanced strike capacity, evolving from the older Mirage-2000 jets used in earlier operations. The Rafale's advanced avionics, impressive flight characteristics, and the integration of India-specific enhancements, such as the Israeli Helmet-Mounted Display and enhanced electronic warfare capabilities, dramatically improve its operational effectiveness in contested airspace. With the successful execution of Operation Sindoor, India has sent a strong strategic message to its adversaries about its commitment to responding decisively to security threats, underlining a credible deterrence posture against both Pakistan and China. Fog of War Flares: Conflicting Claims from both sides.

Amid the swirling fog of war, whispers surfaced that an Indian fighter jet had plummeted near Pampore after being struck by a Pakistani missile—others countered that it was merely a mechanical failure during routine patrol—while equally contentious rumors claimed Pakistani sources boasted of downing an Indian Mirage, only for Indian military insiders to refute any loss on their side. At the same time, reports trickled in of a Pakistani JF-17 obliterated over Akhnoor as it allegedly breached Indian airspace, though some analysts suggested the wreckage might instead be from a downed drone. Local villagers swore they heard the thunder of rockets and saw a fiery plume rising east of the Line of Control, yet both armies issued terse denials: Islamabad insisted no aircraft had been lost, whereas Indian news outlets and social media handles maintained it had shot down an intruder—and that, in turn, was dismissed as propaganda by Pakistani commentators—leaving observers to sift through conflicting claims as tensions along the Himalayan frontier soared.

India Informs US, Russia, UK, and Saudi Arabia on Operation Sindoor

India recently briefed several key nations, including the US, Russia, the UK, and Saudi Arabia, about its military operation, dubbed Operation Sindoor, which targeted nine terror infrastructure sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Kashmir in retaliation for the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 individuals, including 25 Indians and one Nepali. The operation, carried out by a coordinated effort among the Indian Army, Navy, and Air Force, successfully struck locations associated with prominent terrorist organizations such as Jaish-e-Mohammed and Lashkar-e-Taiba, demonstrating India's commitment to holding accountable those responsible for terrorist acts against its citizens. While US Secretary of State Marco Rubio acknowledged the situation and

expressed hope for a quick de-escalation, India's Ministry of Defence clarified that the strikes were focused and non-escalatory, specifically avoiding Pakistani military facilities. The ongoing monitoring by international leaders underscores the geopolitical sensitivity surrounding India-Pakistan tensions, with India reinforcing its stance on national security and the necessity of decisive action against terrorism, thus portraying a strong defense strategy that emphasizes accountability and precision in military operations.

India's NSA Doval vows decisive action against Pakistan provocations

Indian Army Strikes Back, Inflicting Losses on Pakistani Forces

In a significant escalation of hostilities, the Indian Army effectively retaliated against ceasefire violations by the Pakistan Army, inflicting casualties during intense artillery exchanges along the Line of Control (LoC). This response follows India's Operation Sindoor, which targeted nine terror infrastructure sites in Pakistan and Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoK), marking India's most considerable military action in over five decades. The operation was initiated in the wake of a brutal terror attack in Pahalgam, resulting in the deaths of 26 individuals, including Indian civilians. the right to defend itself. This episode reflects the volatile nature of Indo-Pak relations, highlighting the risks of rapid escalation following terrorist incidents and the necessity for both sides, under international observation, to seek de-escalation to prevent further conflict.

Kashmir Crisis: Pakistan Responds After India Strikes Terror Sites

IAF Secures Chandigarh and Amritsar Airports Amid Terror Threats

Its design enhances crew safety and situational awareness, with features like a revolutionary layout for improved visibility and air transport compatibility. This innovation reaffirms FNSS's role in supplying cutting-edge armoured vehicles, particularly for the Turkish Armed Forces, while highlighting a trend towards enhanced capabilities in the global defense landscape.

DRDO's TGS: A Lightweight Artillery System with Range Trade-Off [SHARE](#)

The Indian Army's quest for a lightweight artillery system has advanced with the DRDO's Towed Gun System (TGS) program, offering a modified 155mm/52 calibre howitzer under 15 tons, featuring a 23-litre chamber instead of the original 25-litre from the ATAGS. While this change enhances mobility for deployment in challenging terrains, it may reduce range from 48 kilometres to approximately 40-45 kilometre. This strategic pivot reflects the Army's need for rapid deployability, aligning with modern warfare lessons while maintaining compatibility with advanced ammunition. The TGS aims to enhance operational flexibility, making it a core component of India's artillery fleet despite the trade-off in range.

IITs, ISRO, and DRDO Boost Creep Resistance of 3D-Printed Inconel

Researchers from prestigious Indian institutions, including IITs and ISRO, in collaboration with DRDO, have made a breakthrough in enhancing the creep resistance of 3D-printed Inconel 718, a crucial superalloy for aerospace applications. By optimizing post-processing heat treatment, they achieved a fivefold increase in the creep rupture life of this alloy, making it comparable to its traditional wrought form. This advancement allows for more reliable and cost-effective production of aerospace components, benefiting ISRO's rocket engines and DRDO's fighter jet projects. Such innovations underscore India's growing capability in materials science, essential for strengthening its aerospace sector and enhancing national defense.

India Unveils Fusion Night Sight for BMP-II: A Leap in Self-Reliance

In a significant advancement towards self-reliance in defense technology, India has developed a Fusion Technology Based Driver Night Sight for the BMP-II under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative. This indigenous system, designed by DRDO's IRDE and produced by India Optel Limited, enhances the

operational capabilities of the Indian Army by integrating advanced imaging systems for improved visibility during nighttime operations. Key features include an uncooled thermal camera and a low-light camera, allowing precise navigation and target acquisition in challenging conditions. This innovation not only addresses a critical gap in armored vehicle capabilities but also underscores India's commitment to fostering defense manufacturing self-sufficiency and reducing reliance on foreign technologies.

VRDE Develops Armored Semi-Hull to Enhance India's Defense Capabilities

The Vehicles Research and Development Establishment (VRDE) is fabricating an armoured semi-hull to bolster India's armoured vehicle capabilities, utilizing advanced materials like Ultra-High Strength Steel (UHSS). This project involves meticulous engineering and stringent testing protocols, including destructive trials at the Terminal Ballistics Research Laboratory (TBRL). The semi-hull design emphasizes resilience, with specific adherence to manufacturing standards, quality checks, and non-destructive testing (NDT). This initiative signifies India's commitment to indigenous defense innovation, aiming to produce robust platforms that can endure extreme conditions, thereby enhancing the operational effectiveness of the Indian armed forces in future engagements.

Indian Navy to Train Rafale M Pilots by 2026 with French Aid

The Indian Navy is set to begin training pilots for the Dassault Rafale M fighter jets in 2026, following a \$7.4 billion agreement with France for 26 jets to enhance its carrier aviation capabilities. Training will leverage the French Navy's expertise and facilities, with Indian MiG-29K pilots transitioning to Rafale M instructors. This initiative aligns with India's Aatmanirbhar Bharat strategy by reducing dependency on foreign experts. The delivery of the first Rafale M is expected in 2028, allowing for a streamlined training process due to similarities with the Rafale jets already in service with the Indian Air Force, thereby strengthening India's maritime defense capabilities amid regional tensions.

DRDO Achieves Breakthrough in Turbo-Fan Engine Blade Development SHARE

Geopolitics and Security Alliances

Pakistan Open to De-escalation if India Halts Military Actions SHARE

Cybersecurity and Information Warfare

Operation Sindoor: Misinformation on Indian Jet Downing Debunked

India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7, targeting terrorist infrastructure in Pakistan following a deadly attack that killed 26 civilians. In response, Pakistan purportedly retaliated with shelling along the Line of Control. However, misleading claims circulated on social media suggesting that an Indian Jaguar fighter jet was shot down by Pakistan. A fact-check revealed that videos shared were edited, using visuals from an earlier IAF crash in April to falsely associate them with the current operation. This misinformation underscores the ongoing information warfare between India and Pakistan, highlighting the importance of accurate reporting amidst heightened tensions in the region.

Pakistan Launches Disinformation Campaign After India's Operation Sindoor

Following India's successful Operation Sindoor, the I&B Ministry reported that Pakistan has launched a widespread disinformation campaign, fabricating claims of military victories and spreading outdated images and videos to mislead the public. Kaspersky warns of rising on-device cyberthreats to Indian firms

Kaspersky has reported a significant rise in on-device cyberthreats targeting Indian businesses, with nearly 2 crore malware attacks detected in 2024 alone, marking a 12% increase from 2023. These threats exploit offline methods, such as USB drives, which can bypass traditional cybersecurity defenses. The firm highlights the importance of proactive measures for organizations, including enhancing cybersecurity training, updating software regularly, and implementing advanced security solutions to combat these localized threats. This situation underscores the critical need for Indian businesses to prioritize cybersecurity, especially as the risks associated with human behavior and offline attacks grow increasingly sophisticated.

Pakistani Hackers Claim Breach of Indian Defence Websites

Pakistani cyber attackers, identifying as the Pakistan Cyber Force, have claimed breaches of Indian defence websites, compromising sensitive data from institutions like the Military Engineering Services and the Manohar Parrikar Institute for Defence Studies and Analyses. They also defaced the website of Armoured Vehicles Nigam Limited, prompting it to go offline for security audits. Kaspersky reveals Lazarus Group's cyberattacks on South Korean supply chains

Kaspersky's GReAT team has unveiled a sophisticated cyberattack campaign, dubbed Operation SyncHole, led by the Lazarus Group, targeting South Korean supply chains across various sectors. The attackers exploited vulnerabilities in widely used software, specifically Innorix Agent, facilitating malware installation and lateral movements within networks. This campaign underscores the critical security risks posed by third-party software, particularly in niche markets reliant on outdated tools. Kaspersky emphasizes the need for proactive cybersecurity measures, including regular

software updates and comprehensive audits, to safeguard against such advanced persistent threats, highlighting the importance of robust defenses in today's digital landscape.

India Calls Out China's Global Times for Spreading False Reports on IAF Jets
