#### India's 'Bhargavastra' Successfully Test-Fires Against Drone Swarms S SHARE

14-May-25

India successfully test-fired the indigenous 'Bhargavastra' counter-drone system, developed by Solar Defence and Aerospace Limited (SDAL), marking a significant advancement in countering drone swarm threats. This low-cost system features unguided micro rockets and quided micro-missiles, achieving operational effectiveness in detecting and neutralizing drones within a 2.5 km range. Its modular design allows for integration with existing military infrastructure and offers layered defense capabilities, including soft-kill measures. The 'Bhargavastra' exemplifies India's "Make in India" initiative, showcasing innovation in defense technology while enhancing the nation's Air Defence capabilities and addressing evolving warfare challenges effectively.

# India's defense exports surge 34-fold to Rs 23,622 crore in a decade. SHARE

India's defense exports have soared to an all-time high of Rs 23,622 crore (approximately USD 2.76 billion) in FY 2024-25, marking a 34-fold increase over the past decade, showcasing the country's commitment to selfreliance through the Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative. The government's indigenous strategic focus on manufacturing, supported by production-linked incentive schemes, has significantly boosted defense production and exports, with over 80 countries receiving a variety of defense goods, including

ammunition and arms. The Nifty India Defence index has surged over 30% in the last three months, reflecting investor confidence amid rising tensions with Pakistan and the successful deployment of indigenous defense systems. The rise in defense manufacturing has translated into substantial returns for investors, with key defense stocks like Hindustan Aeronautics and Bharat Electronics experiencing remarkable gains of up to 1,650% over the past five years. This trend not only underlines India's transformation from an importdependent military force to one that emphasizes selfreliance but also highlights its growing role in the global defense supply chain, as seen through increased exports and collaborations with international firms. Overall, India's defense sector is evolving robustly, contributing to national security and economic growth.

### Operation Sindoor: A Showcase of India's Defense Manufacturing Prowess Share

Operation Sindoor has significantly showcased India's growing defense manufacturing capabilities, notably under the Make in India initiative, with successes in drones, the BrahMos missile, and the Akash air defense system. The operation highlighted India's potential in arms exports, with record sales anticipated. Key advancements included the effective employment of domestic drones and munitions, underscoring India's industrial depth and reliability in the global arms market. To capitalize on this success, a focused investment strategy in a few high-impact systems is essential. Increasing defense spending is imperative for maintaining military efficacy and national security amidst global uncertainties, reflecting that a robust military underpins economic stability.

# US Finalizes \$142B Arms Deal with Saudi Arabia, Boosting Defense Ties Share

The U.S. has finalized a historic arms package for Saudi Arabia valued at nearly \$142 billion, marking the largest defense cooperation agreement in U.S. history, aimed at enhancing military capabilities in areas such as air and missile defense. While the deal includes various defense contractors, the potential sale of F-35 jets remains uncertain due to concerns about maintaining Israel's qualitative military edge. This agreement underscores the U.S.'s commitment to its partnership with Saudi Arabia, despite previous delays and Congressional scrutiny surrounding arms sales linked to geopolitical issues. For India, this reinforces the need to bolster its own defense capabilities and partnerships in a rapidly evolving regional security environment.

# Chinese Defense Stocks Plummet Amid India's Rising Military Confidence Stare

Chinese defense equities, particularly those of Avic Chengdu and Zhuzhou Hongda, have sharply declined following India's recovery of intact PL-15E missiles. which raises doubts about the effectiveness of Chinese weaponry. The downturn in stocks was exacerbated by a surprise ceasefire between India and Pakistan and India's demonstrated air defense capabilities during recent conflicts. In contrast, Indian defense stocks have rallied, driven by Prime Minister Modi's emphasis on military self-reliance and effective operations like Operation Sindoor, showcasing India's growing defense capabilities and investor confidence in its domestic industry. This situation highlights a shift in regional dynamics, reinforcing India's strategic advantages over Chinese military offerings.

# Aerolloy Technologies Launches India's Largest Titanium Facility for Defense Self-Reliance Share

Aerolloy Technologies has inaugurated India's largest titanium and superalloy facility in Lucknow, enhancing self-reliance in defense manufacturing. This state-of-the-art plant, part of the Uttar Pradesh Defence Industrial Corridor, can produce 6,000 tonnes of high-grade materials annually, significantly reducing India's dependency on costly imports, which currently cost around ₹14,000 crore annually. Alongside, seven additional facilities were laid out to create a vertically integrated supply chain for aerospace materials, bolstering India's strategic autonomy. This initiative

symbolizes India's transition from a defense consumer to a global manufacturer and exporter, aligning with the Atmanirbhar Bharat vision, and reinforcing its geopolitical resilience and economic strength.

# Hellenic Air Force Considers India's Rudram Missiles for Rafales Share

The Hellenic Air Force (HAF) is showing interest in India's Rudram-1 and Rudram-2 anti-radiation missiles for integration with its Rafale jets to enhance its suppression of enemy air defenses (SEAD) capabilities. Developed by DRDO, these missiles offer a compelling alternative to the U.S.-made AGM-88 HARM, which Greece currently relies on. With a competitive price point and robust indigenous production, the Rudram series addresses gaps in European NATO partners' anti-radar capabilities, especially as they await new solutions like the MBDA RJ10. India's potential to supply advanced SEAD solutions signifies a strategic move in defense exports and strengthens India's position in the global defense market.

# Upgraded S-125 Air Defense System Shines Against Drones, Ready Till 2030 SHARE

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has successfully demonstrated the upgraded S-125 Neva/Pechora air defense system during recent border skirmishes, effectively neutralizing Turkish-made drones used by the Pakistani Army. The system, originally introduced in late 1970s, has undergone significant the modernization, including digitization, advanced radar integration, and mobility enhancements, ensuring its operational viability until 2030. This refurbishment aligns with India's Atmanirbhar Bharat initiative, showcasing the country's commitment to indigenous defense modernization. The S-125's successful engagement of advanced UAVs underscores India's capability to maintain and enhance legacy systems to counter emerging aerial threats effectively.

# DRDO Launches Centre for Electromagnetic Railgun Technology SHARE

The DRDO has inaugurated the Centre for Electromagnetic Launch Technology (CEMaLT) to spearhead research in EM Railgun systems, marking a significant advancement in India's defense capabilities. ensuring self-reliance in critical technologies. EM Railguns, which operate without chemical propellants, promise enhanced range, precision, and lethality, redefining modern combat dynamics. By establishing CEMaLT, India positions itself among a select group of nations advancing in this domain, underscoring its commitment to Atmanirbharta in defense technologies.

# BEL and Embraer Forge Partnership to Boost India's Military Aviation Share

Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) and Brazilian aerospace firm Embraer are exploring a strategic collaboration to enhance India's military aerospace capabilities. This partnership aims to integrate BEL's expertise in radar, avionics, and electronic warfare with Embraer's advanced platforms like the Millennium and A-29 Super Tucano, positioning India to replace aging transport aircraft and enhance tactical airlift capabilities. By co-developing customized solutions, the collaboration could significantly bolster India's defense industrial base, reduce import dependency, and strengthen ties with Brazil, fostering broader South-South cooperation. This initiative marks a pivotal step towards establishing India as a key player in the global aerospace supply chain.

### India's 1000km LRLACM Missile Stuns Global Defense at DEFEA 2025 SHARE

India's indigenous Long Range Land Attack Cruise Missile (LRLACM), showcased at the DEFEA 2025 exhibition in Athens, has drawn significant global attention, underlining India's growing prowess in missile technology and commitment to self-reliance in defense manufacturing. This subsonic cruise missile, with a range of 1,000 kilometers, features stealth capabilities and can be launched from diverse platforms, including mobile ground units and naval vessels. The LRLACM's advanced features, such as precise navigation and intricate maneuverability, position it competitively alongside international systems like the US Tomahawk and Russia's Kalibr. Interest from countries like Greece indicates a potential for future defense collaborations, enhancing India's strategic partnerships.

# Funding Dispute Threatens U.S. Navy's New Stealth Fighter Program Stealth Fighter Program

The U.S. Navy's F/A-XX program, aimed at developing a new carrier-based stealth fighter to replace the aging F/A-18 Super Hornet fleet, faces potential delays due to funding disputes within the Pentagon. While the Navy seeks to award a contract soon, some officials advocate for a three-year postponement, jeopardizing the program's viability. This delay is particularly concerning as it could hinder the Navy's future capabilities in the Indo-Pacific, especially in light of China's advancing fighter technology. Lawmakers are pushing back against these funding cuts, emphasizing the necessity of modernizing naval aviation to maintain strategic superiority.

# China's Arms Credibility Plummets After Operation Sindoor Failures S SHARE

The recent conflict between India and Pakistan, specifically during Operation Sindoor, has severely undermined the credibility of Chinese-made military systems used by Pakistan, as showcased by the failure of advanced weaponry like the PL-15 missiles and the HQ-9 air defense systems. India's decisive air operations led to the downing of multiple Pakistani aircraft, raising doubts about the reliability of Chinese military technology, which constitutes approximately 81% of Pakistan's arms imports. This substantial operational failure has not only tarnished Pakistan's military reputation but has also dealt a significant blow to China's ambitions in the global arms market, as investor confidence in Chinese defense stocks plummeted following these events. Analysts suggest that the performance of Chinese systems in this conflict could compel nations to reconsider procurement choices, potentially opting for more reliable alternatives from Western or Russian suppliers, thereby jeopardizing China's long-term strategic goals as a leading arms exporter. The implications extend beyond South Asia, highlighting a potential shift in global defense dynamics as countries reassess the

value of Chinese weaponry in light of battlefield performance.

# Turkey's Military Role in Pakistan's Drone Attacks on India Exposed Share

Recent reports indicate significant Turkish military support for Pakistan during a four-day border conflict with India, allegedly involving 350 drones and military operatives. In India's Operation Sindoor, launched after a deadly terrorist attack, over 100 terrorists were reportedly eliminated, while Turkish-made drones were used in retaliatory strikes against Indian positions. The alleged deaths of two Turkish operatives during these operations reflect Ankara's direct involvement, leading to public backlash in India, including calls to boycott Turkish goods. # India Bans Chinese Media for Spreading Pakistani Misinformation Share

India has banned Chinese state-run media outlets Xinhua News Agency and Global Times from the microblogging site X for disseminating Pakistani propaganda and unverified information amid rising tensions with Islamabad. This decision follows the Indian Embassy's warning to local media against sharing misinformation, particularly after the Global Times reported unverified claims about Pakistan downing Indian jets, which were based on dubious military sources. The Indian government emphasized the importance of journalistic integrity, highlighting the spread of misleading information, such as old images circulated as evidence of recent events. This action underscores India's proactive stance in countering misinformation in the geopolitical arena.

# India Dismisses Trump's Claims on Mediating India-Pak Ceasefire Share

India's Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) has firmly rejected U.S. President Trump's claims of mediating a ceasefire between India and Pakistan, emphasizing a strict bilateral approach to Jammu & Kashmir issues. The MEA clarified that any ceasefire was directly negotiated between military leaders of both nations, prompted by India's significant military actions against Pakistan. They dismissed Trump's assertions regarding

trade threats and averting nuclear war, asserting that India's military response was purely conventional and based on Pakistan's actions. The government reinforced its stance against third-party intervention, urging the international community to avoid scenarios involving nuclear escalation that could destabilize the region.

# India's Operation Sindoor Shakes Global Power Dynamics Shakes Shakes

14-May-25

Operation Sindoor, launched on May 7, 2025 in retaliation for Pakistan-backed terror attacks in Pahalgam, saw the Indian Air Force employ BrahMos and Akash missiles alongside indigenous electronic-warfare systems to neutralize at least 20 percent of Pakistan Air Force radar and drone installations-including nine airbases such as Mushaf and Nur Khan-within a 23-minute strike that meticulously avoided crossing the Line of Control. The operation marked a departure from India's historical restraint, showcasing "Aatmanirbhar" innovation by defeating Chinese-supplied PL-15 missiles and Turkish-style Bayraktar drones with domestically developed technology. Satellite imagery released by the Indian Armed Forces illustrated extensive damage at terror camps in Muridke and Bahawalpur and radar sites along the western frontier. Targets even allegedly included Pakistan's secretive Kirana Hills nuclear hub, underscoring the strategic breadth of the strikes. Prime Minister Narendra Modi declared that India would no longer tolerate nuclear coercion or cross-border terrorism, linking future diplomatic engagement to Pakistan's suppression of militant groups. This assertive posture has unsettled Western and Chinese observers, prompting analysts to anticipate a strategic recalibration in South Asia as global powers adjust to an increasingly confident and independent India poised to reshape regional geopolitics.

# India Voices Concern Over Bangladesh's Awami League Ban Share

India expressed concern over Bangladesh's interim government's ban on the Awami League party, emphasizing the need for free and fair elections. The ban, enacted under the Anti-Terrorism Act, is perceived as a curtailment of democratic freedoms amidst deteriorating India-Bangladesh relations following Sheikh Hasina's ousting. The Indian External Affairs Ministry highlighted the importance of upholding

democratic processes, while Bangladesh's interim government justified the ban as a measure for national security and to protect activists. This situation raises critical questions about regional stability, democratic values, and the broader implications for bilateral ties between India and Bangladesh.

### India Welcomes Back BSF Jawan Purnam Kumar Shaw from Pakistan Share

Pakistan has returned BSF jawan Purnam Kumar Shaw to India after he was detained for 21 days following an inadvertent crossing into Pakistani territory during operational duty. The handover occurred at the Attari-Wagah border, conducted peacefully under established protocols. Following his return, Shaw will undergo medical check-ups and an inquiry into circumstances of his apprehension. This incident highlights the importance of ongoing communication between the BSF and Pakistani Rangers, which facilitated his repatriation amidst heightened tensions due to recent terrorist activities. Shaw's safe return reinforces India's commitment to safeguarding its personnel while addressing cross-border issues diplomatically.

#### **Military Operations**

# Operation Underway to Clear Unexploded Shells in J-K Villages Share

A significant operation is currently underway in Jammu and Kashmir to clear border villages of unexploded artillery and mortar shells fired by Pakistan, following intense cross-border shelling from May 7 to May 10. The Indian Army and police bomb disposal squads have been actively defusing these shells, which pose a danger to returning residents in areas like Rajouri and Poonch, where many families fled due to heavy shelling that resulted in fatalities and extensive property damage. The Chief Secretary of Jammu and Kashmir, Atal Dulloo, has assured that residents will be rehabilitated and compensated for their losses, and he emphasized the need for underground bunkers for safety in light of the recent violence. Reports indicate that around 28 people were killed, and over 50 injured due to the shelling, prompting the Indian government to take immediate action. This escalation in hostilities followed India's decisive military operation, Operation Sindoor, aimed at neutralizing terror threats in response to the Pahalgam attack that claimed multiple lives. The Indian Army's proactive stance in defusing unexploded shells and urging locals to report suspicious objects reflects a commitment to ensuring civilian safety amidst ongoing tensions with Pakistan. As residents gradually return, there are calls for more protective measures, including additional bunkers, highlighting the need for long-term solutions to safeguard lives in border areas. # INS Vikrant Leads 36-Ship Fleet to Strike Karachi Port share

#### Security forces achieve a major victory, killing 31 Naxals in Kurraguttalu

# Manipur security forces nab 14 militants and 3 arms dealers. Share

# Punjab Woman Dies After Pakistani Aerial Attack; Protests Erupt S SHARE

A 50-year-old woman in Punjab, injured by debris during a Pakistani aerial intrusion, has died, prompting her family to block a highway in protest, demanding Rs 1 crore in compensation and martyr status. The incident involved severe burn injuries to her husband and son from an unidentified projectile that struck their home. Following public outcry and political intervention, the Chief Minister raised the ex-gratia amount to Rs 10 lakh. This incident underscores the ongoing tensions along India's western border, where Indian security forces have effectively countered multiple aerial attacks, demonstrating their readiness and resilience against external threats while also highlighting the humanitarian impact of such conflicts on civilians.

# IAF Destroys Chinese HQ-9 Missile System in Pakistan, Exposing Vulnerabilities Share

On May 8, 2025, during Operation Sindoor, the Indian Air Force neutralized a Chinese-manufactured HQ-9 surface-to-air missile battery deployed near Lahore by employing advanced loitering munitions that exploited its radar blind spots. Under cover of night, Israel-origin Harpy-2 drones—operating autonomously with anti-radiation seekers—and homegrown SkyStriker systems loitered at low altitude to evade Pakistan's integrated air-defense network, executed electronic-warfare jamming to disrupt target discrimination algorithms, and destroyed the HQ-9 installation in under

23 minutes. The strike exposed persistent vulnerabilities in the HQ-9 architecture—particularly its limited ability to engage low-signature threats and outdated engagement software-echoing failures of Chinese export models during India's 2019 Balakot operation. Analysts point to inadequate Pakistani crew training and logistical support as compounding factors, raising questions about Beijing's defense-equipment export reliability. This mission not only underscored India's growing mastery of stand-off tactics and precision strike capabilities but also signaled a strategic inflection point in South Asian power dynamics, likely prompting Pakistan and other customers to reassess the combat performance of Chinese surface-to-air systems under real-world conditions.

# IAF Dismantles China's YLC-8E Radar, Undermining Its Reputation SHARE

The Indian Air Force (IAF) has successfully destroyed the Chinese-made YLC-8E anti-stealth radar system at Pakistan's Chunian Air Base during "Operation Sindoor," marking a significant setback for both Pakistan's defense capabilities and China's military technology reputation. This radar, touted by China as a leading antistealth system, was intended to enhance Pakistan's air defense against Indian aircraft like the Rafale. Its destruction has exposed vulnerabilities in Pakistan's air defense framework, raising concerns about the effectiveness of Chinese military exports under Pakistani operational conditions. This strategic operation illustrates India's proactive approach in countering aerial threats and enhancing its air superiority in the region.

#### **Terrorism and Counterterrorism**

### Operation Keller: India Strikes Back at Lashkar Terrorists Post-Attack Share

In response to the recent Pahalgam terror attack, which resulted in civilian casualties and heightened tensions between India and Pakistan, Indian security forces launched "Operation Keller" targeting Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) operatives in South Kashmir's Shoekal Keller. The success of Operation Keller, following the earlier "Operation Sindoor" which targeted terror camps in Pakistan, demonstrates India's commitment to a zero-tolerance policy towards cross-border terrorism and reaffirms the operational readiness of Indian forces to respond decisively to threats against its sovereignty. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's warning of stringent consequences for future attacks underlines the seriousness of India's approach to restoring security in Jammu and Kashmir and deterring terrorist activities.

### Javed Akhtar calls out Pak Army for disrespecting its fallen soldiers S SHARE
